†*Per semester.* GRAs with 25% FTE must take at least 9 credit hours each in fall & spring. Those with 50% FTE must take 6 credit hours, but may take more. Therefore, it is recommended to factor in tuition for 9 credit hours, even for those with 50% appointments. An increase of 10% should be factored in each year for tuition.

\*All students on an assistantship, regardless of FTE, are required to take 3 credit hours in summer, but may take more.

††Normally these fees are paid by the student, except in special circumstances.
